### Voting Information Updates

The Butler County Bureau of Elections approved a second polling location for Jackson Township in August.

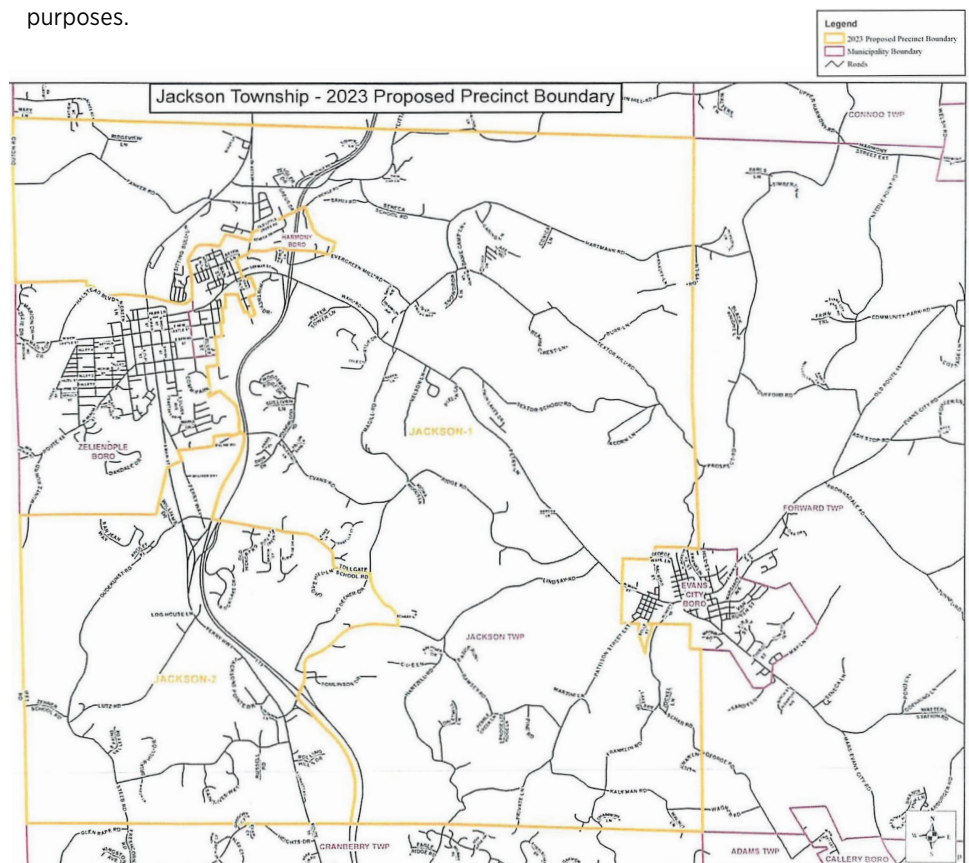
- Jackson Township 1 is located at Jackson Township Building, 140 Magill Road, Zelienople, PA 16063
- Jackson Township 2 is located at Rock Lake Community Center, 113 Rock Lake Drive, Zelienople, PA 16063

The Butler County Bureau of Elections mailed out updated polling locations for residents, and they should have received them by the end of September 2023. There was also a public notice in the *Butler Eagle*.



If the polling location is different, residents will get a new voting ID card. Please see map below that shows how the Township is divided for polling purposes.

## UNDER CONSTRUCTION, REVIEW

The following projects are newly under construction in the Township.

### Residential:

- Seneca Hills, 70 townhomes, located off of Metcalf Road.
- Woodland Reserve, 124 single-family units with a mix of quads, duplexes, and single-family homes, on Pattison Street Extension.
- Seneca Trails Phase 2B, with 43 single-family homes; is a continuation of an existing plan on Gudekunst Road.

The Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors have reviewed and approved the following projects:

### Commercial:

- Jackson Village, a planned shopping center on Rt. 19 and Little Creek Road received preliminary approval for nine commercial establishments including a grocery store, auto-parts store, convenience store/gas station, bank, and drive-thru restaurants to be built in seven phases. Phase 1 and Phase 2 are in the process of getting final approvals

and wish to start construction as soon as possible.

- Cooper Property, a planned shopping center on Rt. 19, will combine existing retail and services into a planned shopping center with access to the new light at SR. 19. The new building will include offices/retail with residential dwelling units on the second floor. ■

## PLANS FOR THE PARK

The Township has received a third round of Community Conservation Partnerships Program Grant funding for the construction of a concession stand with restrooms and outdoor dining area at Sippel Reservoir Park. The building's design is actively underway with bidding

to occur late this year and construction in the Spring of 2024. Located along a regional trail network, the facility will serve as a center for activity for Sippel Reservoir Park and the Township's broader parks and trails system. ■



## WINTER WEATHER, LINDSAY ROAD MAINTENANCE



SR 528, Lindsay Road, within Jackson Township is and continues to be a State Road, maintained by PennDOT. With the assistance and support of PennDOT Butler County Maintenance and our municipal services representative from PennDOT District 10, the Township has formalized an agreement by which we are paid for and assume winter maintenance responsibilities. Given PennDOT's need to focus on main roads and stretched resources, the Township looks forward to providing local winter maintenance on Lindsay Road, beginning this season. The hope is for the Jackson Township's Road Crew to provide a more timely response and level of service, given the active local winter maintenance of the surrounding road network. ■

## AS A REMINDER

In our efforts to provide more reliable communications with Residents and Businesses in the Township, we have contracted with Rave Mobile Safety/Smart 911 (formerly SwiftReach Networks, Inc.) as our Emergency Notification service provider.

Rave Mobile Safety/Smart911 is a system that makes phone calls to specific people or areas in the event of an emergency or for sharing important information. These messages may include information on fires, road closures, evacuation orders and weather emergencies. All the calls you receive will have the Caller ID of "Jackson Township." In addition to phone calls



this system can also send text messages and emails.

In order to have the system fully functional and to make sure you are going to receive the alerts please take a moment to visit the portal and add or update your contact information, the system currently only includes listed numbers. Your information will not be provided to any outside agencies or companies. You may also remove yourself from our lists.

### MEET CANYON

There is a new dog in town!

Jackson Township Police Department welcomed Canyon, their new K-9 Officer, who started his first day at the Township on Tuesday, Sept. 5, after getting sworn in at the Magistrate's office.

Canyon, a Belgian Malinois, is one year and two months old.



He had four weeks of training before partnering with his handler, Jackson Township Police Officer Vaughn Pulgini. The two then trained together for the next nine weeks at DSG Training in Monaca.

Canyon is now certified in Canine patrol,



tracking and narcotics detection.

With the welcome of Canyon, we wish former K-9, Aron who was in service for eight years with this department, a happy retirement! ■

## NEW SCHOOL YEAR BRINGS STUDENTS, SCHOOL BUSES BACK TO ROADS

The third week of October marks National School Bus Safety week. In honor of that, the Township wants to remind all drivers that school bus safety is a high priority in Pennsylvania. Please do your part when driving and abide by Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law:

- When you meet a stopped school bus with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you **MUST STOP**.
- When you approach an intersection where a school bus is stopped with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you **MUST STOP**, whether you are on the same street or the cross street.
- You **MUST STOP** at least 10 feet away from the school bus.
- Drivers do not have to stop on a highway with clearly defined dividing sections or physical barriers providing separate roadways. This only applies when the school bus is on the opposite side of the road.



- You **MUST WAIT** until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm has been withdrawn before moving.
- **DO NOT MOVE** until all the children have reached a place of safety. Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law

If you are convicted of violating Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law, you will receive all of the following penalties:

- 60-Day Driver's License Suspension
- Five points on your driving record
- \$250 Fine

## HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

Jackson Township's Trick or Treat will be held from 6-8 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 31. Jackson Township Police will be patrolling the area to ensure everyone is safe, however, see tips below from The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and the National Safety Council to keep your children and yourself safe this Halloween.

### Costume Safety

- All costumes, wigs and accessories should be fire-resistant
- If children are allowed out after dark, fasten reflective tape to their costumes and bags, or give them glow sticks
- Opt for nontoxic Halloween makeup over masks, which can obscure vision; always test makeup in a small area first to see if any irritation develops
- Remove all makeup before children go to bed to prevent skin and eye irritation

### Safety Tips for Pedestrians

- Walk on a sidewalk if one is available and use crosswalks.
- Before the Halloween festivities begin, create a "buddy system" to get each other home safely and prevent walking alone.
- A responsible adult should accompany young children on the neighborhood rounds
- If older children are going alone, plan and review a route acceptable to you
- Agree on a specific time children should return home
- Teach your children never to enter a stranger's home or car
- Instruct children to travel only in familiar, well-lit areas and stick with their friends
- Tell your children not to eat any treats until they return home, and take care to avoid any food allergies

### Safety Tips for Drivers

- Watch for children walking on roadways, medians and curbs
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys carefully
- At twilight and later in the evening, watch for children in dark clothing



- Discourage new, inexperienced drivers from driving on Halloween
- Be alert for trick-or-treaters on Halloween. Slow down and continue to scan the road in areas where they are likely to be or where sight distances are limited.
- On Halloween there will likely be more pedestrians on the roads and in places where they are not expected. Slower speeds save lives.
- Stay alert for pedestrians who may come

out from between parked cars or behind shrubbery. Stop, wait for them to pass.

- Don't look at your phone when you're driving. Your attention needs to always be on the road.
- If you see a drunk driver on the road, contact law enforcement.

## CDC IS SEEKING FUNDS FOR DOG PARK

The Jackson Township Community Development Corporation (CDC) is a nonprofit, volunteer-based organization that routinely partners with the Township, Township property owners, and neighboring communities to facilitate recreational and infrastructure improvements.

The CDC helps to organize and support volunteers and particular causes. As a private organization, the CDC can complement and expedite Township efforts by facilitating public private partnerships and helping with fundraising.

Recently, area residents began raising funds for a dog park. The Township and the CDC have identified an area near Porter Cove, off of Evergreen Mill Road, as a possible location that could tie into the Township



planned trail network and overall park system. Estimated costs range upwards of \$40,000 with in-kind contributions by the Township Public Works Department helping to reduce costs.

The CDC is seeking donations, sponsorships, and memorials for the dog park. Approximately ten percent of

needed funding has been raised thus by a committed group of volunteers who have teamed up with the CDC to develop the project.
