CDC is seeking funds for Dog Park

Recently, area residents began raising funds for a dog park. The Township and the CDC have identified an area near Porter Cove, off of Evergreen Mill Road, as a possible location that could tie into the Township planned trail network and overall park system. Estimated costs range upwards of \$40,000 with in-kind contributions by the Township Public Works Department helping to reduce costs.

The CDC is seeking donations, sponsorships, and memorials for the dog park. Approximately ten percent of needed funding has been raised thus by a committed group of volunteers who have teamed up with the CDC to develop the project.
